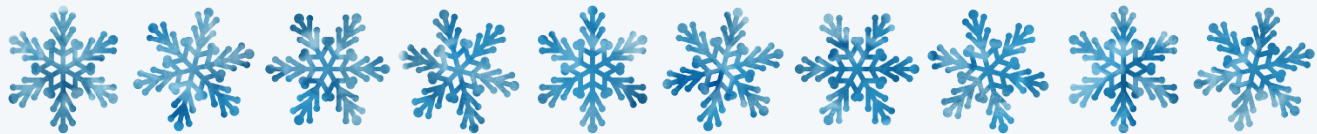

Trip to CTI for Tenth graders was a success!

On February 10th, Mr. Merendino, Mrs. McLaughlin and Mrs. Betti took a group of 25 students to Dutchess BOCES CTI to visit and view some of their program offerings.

Every year CTI hosts sophomore students from all Dutchess County school districts to see what programs are available to them in their Junior year.

Students have the opportunity to visit two different programs of their choice and see what the curriculum entails. This also allows them to see what this hands on learning environment would be like.

CTI is a two-year program that students start during their Junior year of High School. Student can choose from over 15 different programs ranging from Cosmetology to Culinary Arts, Small Engine Technology to Welding and Fabrication.

CTI has added a new program called Esthetics and is also in the process of creating the curriculum for an EMT program to start in the Fall of 2025.

As a Junior, most programs run in the afternoon, Students would be taking the classes here at Webutuck during periods 1-4 and then take the bus to BOCES CTI during 5th period. As seniors, students typically attend BOCES CTI first thing in the morning and then return during 6th period.

Students are asked to include their top three program choices when completing their CTI applications. Students must meet academic, attendance and behavior criteria to be eligible to attend Boces CTI.
