In this course you will learn about the history of New York State and American History from 1865 to the present. The course is divided into eight units, two per marking period. The units are as follows:

1. Causes of the Civil War
2. Civil War and Reconstruction
3. The Industrial Nation and Immigration
4. The Spirit of Reform and America becomes a World Power
5. Changing Nation- World War 1 and the Roaring 20s
6. A World in Crisis- The Great Depression and World War 2
7. Post War America -The Cold War Begins and Peace and Prosperity
8. Searching for Solutions- The Sixties, Equal Rights and Vietnam
9. Modern America- Nixon and the Seventies, The Republican and Clinton Years and America Looks to the Future.

Grades are weighted in the following manner:

Tests and Essays – 35%

Quizzes – 20%

Projects, Activities and Homework--25 %
