School Board Adopts Budget

April 26, 2022 Dear District Residents,

Enclosed, please find your 2022-2023 budget Administration and the Board of information. Education have worked diligently to develop a budget that continues to offer excellent academic and extracurricular programs for our children while at the same time trying to maintain the affordability of these programs for our tax payers. In finding this balance, the Board of Education has adopted a budget in the amount of \$25,039,114 This is a budget to budget increase of **1.0%** and although the allowable tax cap would afford us to levy an increase of 4.90%, the Board of Education has elected to levy a tax levy of 4.70% which is below the allowable tax cap levy. This levy allows for If the resubmitted/revised budget proposal is not approved by qualified homeowners to be eligible for the New Property Relief **York** State Tax Tax Reimbursement.

Please refer to the charts and presentations on our District website www.webutuckschools.org in order to view more information and a calculation of the estimated impact of this budget on your taxes. This budget vote will need a simple majority (50%+1) in order to pass.

Highlights of this budget include:

- Continued support of academic and
- extracurricular programs.
- Continued support of College Level Courses, allowing students to graduate from Webutuck with the possibility of 1 year of college credit.
- Additional courses such as: Computer Science, Entrepreneurship, and Advanced Biology. (STEAM)
- Funding of small projects to address facility needs and maintenance.
- An additional health teacher position to assist with the growing need for health literacy for all students.
- Additional funds that will be used to address the instructional "gap" caused by COVID-19.

What happens if the Budget is not approved by the public?

If the proposed budget is not approved by the 50% + 1required margin:

The district may resubmit the original budget or submit a revised budget to the voters on June 21, 2022.

the required margin:

• The Board of Education must adopt a contingency budget that levies a tax no greater than that of the prior year (0%)increase tax levy) and the budget would be subject to contingent budget requirements. (See explanation below)

Explanation: Last year's tax levy of \$16,216,729 could not be increased (a 0% tax levy increase would be required by law). This would require a net reduction of \$756,970.

Contingent budget figures are shown on page #4.

Contingent budget laws are still in effect.

PROPOSITION I: 2022-2023 Northeast (Webutuck) CSD Budget

SHALL the 2022-2023 Budget as adopted by the Board of Education in the amount of \$25,039,114, with anticipated revenue exclusive of taxes in the amount of \$8,065,415 and the amount to be raised through taxes of \$16,973,699, be approved? YES \square NO \square

PROPOSITION II: 2022-2023 Transportation Vehicle Purchase

SHALL the Board of Education of the Webutuck Central School District be authorized to: (1) acquire two (2) transportation vehicles, one (1) wheelchair accessible mini-bus and one (1) utility vehicle at a maximum aggregate cost not to exceed \$170,000; (2) expend such sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for such purpose; (3) levy the necessary tax therefore, to be levied and collected in annual installments in such years and in such amounts as may be determined by the Board of Education taking into account state aid received; and (4) in anticipation of the collection of such tax, issue bonds and notes of the District at one time or from time to time in the principal amount not to exceed \$170,000, and levy a tax to pay the interest on said obligations when due?

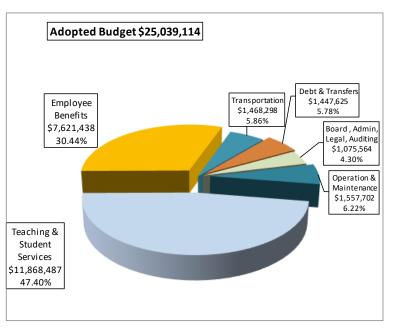
