Evaluate, Review & Focus

- Long list of items to review were generated by Board of Education Facilities Committee, District staff, BCA & Palombo using the BCS, and in-depth review of current conditions
- List was pared down to Priority 1 items



Evaluate, Review & Focus

- Protect our facilities and our investment in them
- Site parking & sidewalk work is necessary due to wear & tear (age)
- Roof replacements are necessary due to its age and lack of warranty
- Components of Sanitary System are necessary due to its age
- Unit Ventilator (UV) replacement to provide a fresh air exchange
- Air Conditioning to provide WES Classrooms appropriate conditions for Summer School Programs



Evaluate, Review & Focus

- Emergency Generator to provide protection of security system, technology and mechanical operations throughout the District
- Age appropriate Playground at EBIS for 4th-8th grade students
- Focus on critical needs no extraneous / "nice to have" work
- Time is right debt coming off from past projects allows new work to be done with no additional tax impact to the community



Why Capital Project Now?

- •Planning for capital improvements **before they become an emergency results** in a more favorable strategy for tax planning and costs purposes.
- •Planned Capital project allows you to bid job to get **best pricing vs. Emergency**Project does not lend itself to the bidding process, and is not required, which puts the District at a disadvantage.
- •The removal of debt from the District's balance sheet, will have a direct result of less building aid and the inability to exclude from the property tax calculation.
- •If debt expires may see a short term reduction in taxes but in the long term if items need to be done in emergency or expedited fashion will result in a **higher** tax rate in the long run.

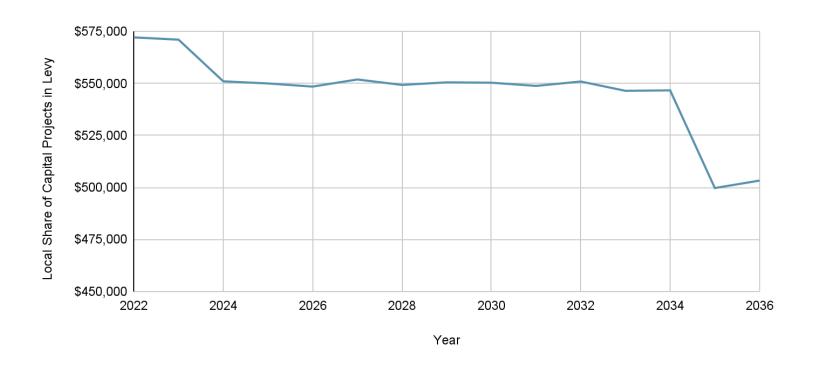

How Will It Impact Your Property Taxes?

The project will be tax neutral on the property tax rate. Which means that this Capital Improvement Project would have no additional impact on the tax payer.

Building Aid on the Project

Project Size of \$12,560,000

Estimated Building Aid on the project would be \$0.594 for every aidable dollar spent.

Estimated Building Aid: \$8,851,007

- October 18 BOE resolutions on SEQRA & Authorization to Vote
- November Public information campaign (meetings, flyers, website information, etc.)
- December 6 Public Referendum
